# Catherine O'Kelly Frank Wallace Fellowship Director

Classical guitarist Catherine O'Kelly is an active performer throughout New England, both as a soloist and as a chamber musician. She performs regularly with her flute and guitar duo, Tedesco Duo, alongside flautist Arielle Burke. Catherine is currently finishing her Doctor of Musical Arts degree in classical guitar performance at The Hartt School in West

Hartford, CT, where she studies with Christopher Ladd. She earned a position with The Hartt School's Honors Chamber Music Program, Performance 20/20, providing her a full scholarship for her doctoral studies. Catherine teaches at The Rivers School Conservatory in Weston, MA; Dana Hall School in Wellesley, MA; and The Powers Music School in Belmont, MA. She is a registered Suzuki teacher, and as a former Suzuki student herself, she is passionate about teaching young students through the Suzuki method.



## Jhon Alvarado Social Media Director

Jhon Alvarado is a devout music educator. Inspired by his studies at the New England Conservatory, Jhon believes that "Music in education plays an essential role in the early stages of a child's development by fostering a growth mindset that rewards and praises students based on effort put forth rather than test score or innate

'talent.'" Jhon is currently located in Boston, MA and teaches guitar to students of all ages through his in-person, online private guitar studio, and Powers Music Studio.

Jhon re-energizes the classical guitar repertoire with captivating contemporary performances of world renowned 20th and 21st century composers. Jhon's performances are always unique and exciting, with the inclusion of music by Toru Takemitsu, George Gianopolous, Dusan Bogdanovich, and many other world-class contemporary composers. Jhon's eclectic concert program's continually take his audience members on trips around the world discovering music from different corners of the globe, often beginning in Latin America and ending as far as Japan and the Middle East. 

# **Artist Series Biographies**



## Adam del Monte

One of the leading flamenco and classical guitarist/composers of his generation, Adam del Monte has made it his life mission to fully express himself in these two genres, transcending labeling and convention. Always having incorporated a wide array of musical styles in his compositions, Del Monte and has embarked on a journey creating a unique sound and language of flamenco that is both steeped in tradition and progressive in its openness to musical flavors from around the world.

Del Monte has recorded for Deutsche Gramophone—the featured flamenco guitar part in the double Grammy award winning opera Ainadamar by Osvaldo Golijov (2006), with soprano Dawn Upshaw and the Atlanta Symphony, conducted by Robert Spano. Since then, he has toured this opera in, Carnegie Hall, NY, Lincoln Center, NY, Barbican Center, London, Colorado Music Festival in Boulder, Chicago Symphony and many more.

Del Monte was both influenced by and inspired the younger generation of flamenco performers who were beginning to depart from the previous virtual space of Spanish flamenco. Del Monte, too, set out in new directions, integrating years of traditional and leading—edge flamenco training as well as expanding his musicianship on the classical guitar. An eclectic awareness of jazz, world music and other contemporary forms led to new, creative renditions of flamenco repertoire.



**Xuefei Yang** 

Xuefei Yang is acclaimed as one of the world's finest classical guitarists. Hailed as a musical pioneer – her fascinating journey began after the Cultural Revolution, a period where Western musical instruments and music were banned. Fei was the first-ever guitarist in China to enter a music school, and became the first internationally recognized Chinese guitarist on the world stage.

Her first public appearance was at the age of ten and received such acclaim that the Spanish Ambassador in China presented her with a concert guitar. Her debut in Madrid at the age of 14 was attended by the composer Joaquin Rodrigo and, when John Williams heard her play, he gave two of his own instruments to Beijing's Central Conservatoire especially for her and other advanced students.

Fei is one of the few guitarists whose artistry connects with audiences far beyond the guitar fraternity. Her international success has led her to be invited to play in more than 50 countries at numerous prestigious venues, and is frequently invited to play with the world's leading orchestras, and collaborate with artists such as Ian Bostridge, Roberto Alagna and Sir James Galway.

Gramophone magazine praised her as one of the leading innovators of her generation for continuing to build the guitar repertoire.



**David Russell** 

We are delighted to welcome the incomparable David Russell back to the BCGS stage to round out our 2022–23 Artist Series.

GRAMMY award winner for his CD AIRE LATINO in the category of best instrumental soloist in classical music.

Honorary Doctorate in Music by the University of Arizona in Tucson in 2014.

Inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Guitar Foundation of America in 2018.

Classical guitarist David Russell is world renowned for his superb musicianship and inspired artistry, having earned the highest praise from audiences and critics alike. In recognition of his great talent and his international career, he was named a Fellow of The Royal Academy of Music in London in 1997.

In May 2003 he was bestowed the great honor of being made "adopted son" of Es Migjorn, the town in Minorca where he grew up. Later the town named a street after him, "Avinguda David Russell".

In November 2003 he was given the Medal of Honor of the Conservatory of the Balearics.

David Russell spends his time touring the world, appearing regularly at prestigious halls in main cities, such as New York, London, Tokyo, Los Angeles, Madrid, Toronto or Rome. Concert-goers everywhere are in awe of his musical genius and inspired by his captivating stage presence.

# Frank A. Wallace Memorial Fellowship – 2022/23

#### **Mission Statement**

The Boston Classical Guitar Society created the Frank A. Wallace Memorial Fellowship to celebrate the music of composer Frank Wallace by engaging young guitarists with his compositions and with other 21<sup>st</sup> century music. The BCGS awards a yearly scholarship to a New England based guitar student between the ages of 16 and 24 to further their musical studies.

## **Applicants**

Restrictions for applicants:

Ages 16-24, and *must* be either a resident of New England or currently studying in New England



Applicants should demonstrate a passion for exploring new music. Beyond classical guitar and composing, Frank Wallace had an expansive range of artistic interests including being an accomplished baritone vocalist and performer on early period stringed instruments. Continuing the legacy of Frank, the recipient of the Frank A. Wallace Memorial Fellowship will be someone who exhibits a diverse range of musical interests and an enthusiasm for sharing new ideas. The BCGS Artistic Committee is looking for a student who will take an active role in fostering a community of sharing ideas, inspiring new music, and celebrating innovation.

#### Fellowship Award

- Honorarium: \$1000
- The Fellow is selected to learn one piece or a set of pieces by Frank Wallace of at least 5 minutes in length plus an additional contrasting piece, preferably of 21<sup>St</sup> century guitar music or a personal composition dedicated to Frank Wallace.
- Three performances to be determined under the BCGS umbrella (examples include performance parties, the library series, the festival, opener for the artist series)
- Publicity features (social media, website, newsletter)

#### **Application Process**

A direct outreach to New England area teachers and institutions will be going out early this fall and an uploadable application form will be provided on our web page <a href="www.bostonguitar.org/wallace">www.bostonguitar.org/wallace</a>. ### **Application form will include:**

- Detailing of your interest in this Fellowship, your experience with the music of Frank Wallace, and your interest/experience in 21st-century guitar music.
- A letter of recommendation
- YouTube videos of two contrasting pieces, one being a Frank Wallace composition, and the second being the applicant's choice, but with 21<sup>st</sup> century music preferred.
- If the applicant is a composer, then a personal composition would be welcome.
- Application deadline: January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023
- The Artistic Committee will review applications and select the Fellow within one month of the deadline.
